

# HOUSEHOLD WASTE COLLECTION

## Guidelines

- The **GREEN** rollout container must be used for storage and disposal of household garbage only
- Place your container along the curb or edge of street prior to 7:30 a.m. and remove it by 7:30 p.m.
- Be sure your container is clear and not obstructed by objects such as vehicles, fences, mailboxes, etc.
- Poisons, combustive or other dangerous and hazardous materials should not be placed in the rollout container

## Non-Collectable Items

- Loose Garbage
- Car Batteries
- Construction materials (e.g. concrete, lumber, bricks, ceramic tiles, sheetrock, roofing, plywood, asbestos items, etc.)
- Carpet and Carpet Padding
- Soil, Sod and Rocks
- Contractor generated home or yard debris

## Yard Debris Pickup Guidelines

You may place the following items curbside for pickup:

- Grass and small hedge trimmings that have been bagged
- Tree limbs no longer than 6 feet and no more than 6 inches in diameter not to exceed 4 cubic yards per collection
- Loose leaves (not near your mailbox)
- Yard waste produced and collected by contractors who work for city residents must be disposed of by the contractor

OR STORM DRAINS**

# CURBSIDE RECYCLING

## Items **TO** Recycle

- Aluminum beverage cans, aluminum foil and aluminum pie pans all rinsed and clean of food
- Brown, Green and Clear glass bottles and jars
- Dry newspaper and inserts as well as brown paper bags
- Magazines, catalogs, mailers, telephone books, and junk mail including envelopes with windows
- Copy paper, notebook paper and computer paper (continuous form, perforated paper)
- Plastic bottles and jugs with a neck (e.g., milk jugs, water jugs, detergent bottles, beverage bottles, etc.) marked with a chasing arrow and a #1 - #7 on the bottom
- Food and beverage steel "tin" cans including empty aerosol cans – all sizes
- Cardboard (e.g., moving boxes, appliance boxes, etc.), paperboard (e.g., cereal boxes, shoe boxes, beverage boxes that have been broken down

Place material in city approved **BLUE** container for proper recycling



## Items **NOT** to Recycle

- Pizza Boxes or any cardboard or paperboard contaminated by food
- Automobile fluids such as motor oil, antifreeze, or brake fluid
- No Hazardous Chemicals
- Shopping Bags
- Styrofoam including Packing "peanuts"

## Need a **RECYCLING** or **TRASH** Container?

City of Mauldin residents can purchase a Recycling and Trash container from the Business & Development Office located at City Hall, 5 East Butler Road

Your container will be delivered to you usually within 24-48. The care and replacement purchase of Recycling and/or Trash containers are the responsibility of the homeowner.

**Trash - \$65**



**Recycle - \$25**



## DID YOU KNOW?

For your convenience Public Works collects your recyclables and trash on the same day.

If your collection day falls on a Holiday, we will service the following work day.

Public Works will pick up your old mattress. Just leave it curbside on the day of your trash pickup.

Paint cans must be dry and mixed with kitty litter or sand and the lid removed to be picked up.

You are allowed up to 4 cubic yards of yard debris per pick up.

Household debris or yard debris generated by a contractor is to be disposed of by the contractor.

You should always remove appliance doors before bringing them to the curb to avoid a potential child or pet hazard.

We will pick up your old television, computer, computer monitor and printers.

Your limbs are collected and recycled to make Mulch.

Loose leaves are collected and turned into compost.

Mauldin residents recycle on average 6,000 pounds per day at curbside.
