Members present were Chairman Dale Black, Committee members Michael Reynolds and Taft Matney. Interim Recreation Director Bart Cumalander and City Administrator Brandon Madden were also present.

**Budget Review** 

Bart reported the budgets look good. Bids have come back from the Springfield Park playgrounds- both top and bottom. The City Park equipment invoice came in today and the equipment has been ordered.

The curbing is in bad shape and needs to be replaced. Pricing is being obtained for that.

The basketball surface at Springfield Park is going to be replaced. The poles will be kept. New backboards will be included as well as taking up the surface and putting it back down. The fencing is ok, but if there is money left over, we may replace the fencing as well. Chairman Black said there is \$21,000 left in paving for City Park. Brandon said we would look at the total cost of paving the walking trail, and if there is any remaining, the concrete curbing could be paid for out of that money.

Bart says there is a live water meter in the walking trail where the tree was. It feeds the Senior Center and concession stand. He doesn't want to cover it up. There is a portion of the frosted glass window that has condensation between the double paned glass and will be replaced by Golden Strip glass. We are hosting a basketball tournament at the Senior Center this weekend. The Sports Center and high school will be used as well.

Baseball signups numbers are up. T ball number are up as well. 11-12 numbers are a little lower, but 7-8 are up. Councilman Matney said the uptick in the

numbers shows that people are willing to invest and participate in our programs. Our fields have always been great.

Bart there will be a Home Run derby and base running competition the weekend before Opening Day. The parents will help with the event to get them more involved. Opening Day is March 28th. The Easter Egg Drop is the weekend after Opening Day. All plans are made for that event.

Councilman Matney asked about the numbers for Lacrosse and flag football. Bart said Lacrosse was still holding sign-ups. Chairman Black asked if we work with the high school on Lacrosse. Bart said Andre is handling that.

#### 8. Committee Concerns

Councilman Reynolds mentioned the batting cages are drooping at Sunset Park. Bart said Public Works handles that, but he is going to find out and it will be taken care of.

Chairman Black asked about the shelter at the Cultural Center. Brandon said we are waiting on Duke to bore. We are putting pressure on them to get it done. Public Works is doing the landscaping now and installing the irrigation system. The stonework is the last aspect of the shelter.

Bart mentioned a grand opening of the park. Elementary school kids could be invited to break in the equipment.

Chairman Black asked about the fence behind Joel Ann's. Brandon said Matt is getting quotes to replace it.

Councilman Reynolds said he had a question on whether dogs are allowed on the cultural center grounds. Brandon said the cultural center has not been designated as a park. After the shelter and playground are complete, Council will be asked if they want to designate the Center as a park. Bart said Willie called and said someone brought a dog into the Sports Center. Bart told Willie to tell them the dogs could not come inside.

This issue will be brought to committee. Councilman Matney said we need to discuss this item further. City Center Drive is a street. You can't keep dogs off of a street. We need to put stations out so that people can pick up their dog's waste.

#### **REQUEST**

This summary is being provided for information only as an update on this matter.

#### HISTORY/BACKGROUND

Members of Council have requested that staff explore the possibility of repairing the wooden fence located at City Park between the Mauldin Open Air Market. Staff's assessment revealed that the fence can be repaired by Public Works staff.

#### **ANALYSIS / STAFF FINDINGS**

The cost of the materials needed for staff to repair the fence totals \$3,000.

#### FINANCIAL IMPACT

Given that this an unbudgeted expense, staff can transfer available funds from the Recreation Department's PARD Grant expenditures line item (875) in the amount of \$3,000 to the Other Expenses (700) line item to cover the cost of materials needed for the Public Works Department to repair the wooden fence.

#### RECOMMENDATION

Staff will proceed accordingly. However, this information is being presented to Council to keep them apprised.

**SUBJECT:** City Park Walking Trail

#### **REQUEST**

The Recreation Committee is requested to approve the expenditure of Park and Recreation Development (PARD) grant funds to repave a portion of the City Park walking trail around the new City Park playground.

#### HISTORY/BACKGROUND

In 2007, the Greenville County Legislative Delegation granted the City of Mauldin \$21,342.19 in PARD grant funds pursuant to the City's grant application for renovating the City Park walking trail. The grant required a 20% match from the City.

#### **ANALYSIS / STAFF FINDINGS**

The City via Cunningham Recreation is currently installing a new playground and surface at City Park. The walking trail that follows along the location of the new playground is in disrepair. Staff obtained prices quotes from paving contractor to repave this portion of the walking trail at City Park, and recommends using Panagakos Asphalt Paving, Inc. with a total cost of \$20,000.

#### FINANCIAL IMPACT

The total cost of the project is \$20,000 of which \$16,000 will be covered by the PARD grant funds. The remaining amount of \$4,000 will be covered by the City to satisfy the 20% grant match associated with the PARD grant.


Matching funds are available in the Council approved FY2020 budget for the Recreation Department.

**SUBJECT:** Springfield Park Playground Agreement with Cunningham Recreation

#### REQUEST

The Public Works Committee is requested to approve an agreement with Cunningham Recreation for the purchase and installation of a playground and surface at Springfield Park.

#### HISTORY/BACKGROUND

In the Council approved FY2020 budget, \$300,000 in the City's Capital Improvement Plan was appropriated for the purchase and installation of a new playground and surface at Springfield Park. Attached is a rendering of the current playgrounds and surfaces at Springfield Park.

#### **ANALYSIS / STAFF FINDINGS**

On January 27, 2020 staff issued a solicitation for Request for Proposals (RFP) for the purchase and installation of a playgrounds and surfaces at Springfield Park. The solicitation closed on February 26, 2020. The City received RFPs from Cunningham Recreation, Bliss Products, Churchich, and Darrs. An internal review Committee evaluated the bids and selected Cunningham Recreation as the lowest and most responsive bidder at a cost of \$268,896 for both playgrounds.

Given that this purchase is for a budgeted item and the bid awarded is for less than or equal to the budget, no additional formal Council approval is needed. However, Council approval is requested for the agreement with Cunningham Recreation.

Also, the Committee is requested to consider an additional item as a component of this project:

#### • Installation of a fence around both playgrounds

Per the request of the Councilor Black as Chair of the Recreation Committee, adding fencing around both playgrounds will provide uniformity with the City's other playgrounds, as the playgrounds at City Park, Sunset Park and the playgrounds along City Center Dr. all have or will have fencing. Based on quotes obtained by staff, the total cost for the fencing will not exceed \$6,500.

#### FINANCIAL IMPACT

The cost of Cunningham Recreation bid is \$268,896.

The cost of the fencing is \$6,500.

A breakdown of the total cost for all of the aforementioned items is detailed in the table below:

#### RECOMMENDATION

The City recommends approval of the following:

- 1. Agreement with Cunningham Recreation for the purchase and installation of playgrounds and surfaces for Springfield Park.
- 2. The purchase and installation of fencing for the playgrounds at a not to exceed cost of \$6,500.

The total cost of all of the aforementioned items is \$278,296 which is \$24,631 less than the Council approved budget of \$300,000 for this project.

GameTime reserves the right to deduct costs associated with restoring returned goods to merchantable condition. Uprights & custom products cannot be returned.
- TAXES: Sales tax is shown as a separate line item when included. A copy of your tax exemption certificate must be submitted at time of order or taxes will be added to your invoice.




