

MAULDIN MAYORS: FORTY YEARS OF HISTORY

Over the past forty years, six people have served as mayor of the City of Mauldin. They gathered in May for a photograph as well as a media interview to be released at a later date.

- Terry Merritt served on Mauldin City Council from 2015 until being elected mayor in 2018.
- Dennis Raines served as mayor of Mauldin from 2011 to 2018.
- Don Godbey was mayor from 2008 to 2011.
- R.C. Jones served two separate terms as Mauldin mayor in years past, from 1988 to 1991 and again from 2004 to 2007. Jones was also a City Council member from 1986 to 1987.
- Wayne Crick served as Mauldin's mayor from 1979 to 1988.
- L.S. Green served as mayor of Mauldin from 1991-2003. Green, who turned 100 years old in March, celebrated his birthday at the Mauldin Sports Center where he is a member and, in lieu of birthday gifts, asked for donations to the Mauldin Cultural Center, which raised almost \$1000 for the Center.


How coronavirus is impacting timelines for 6 major Golden Strip developments.



● FY 2019 ● FY 2020



Mauldin Cultural Center

It is the mission of the Cultural Center to give all citizens and visitors the ability to experience and participate in artistic and cultural activities. In an effort to uphold that mission, the Cultural Team created the hashtag #KeepCreativeUpstate where the public can share ways in which they've stayed creative during the virus outbreak. The Cultural team has re-shared these videos and photos to support those individuals and encourage others.

The Cultural team has been sharing videos from the Center's arts education instructors, from video tutorials to musical performances from their students. Videos are shared weekly through the Cultural Center's e-blast, and can also be found at mauldinculturalcenter.org/video-series.




The Pizza, Blues, & Jazz live event may have been cancelled for this year, but the Cultural Center shared a virtual guide, calling on the community to have their own private PB&J events right in their own homes and backyards. The e-blast contained links, contact information, and business hours for local pizza restaurants, links

to local vendors' online shops, access to music videos from The Greenville Jazz Collective and Roosevelt Collier, and finally contact information for Growler Haus so patrons could purchase their beer/wine to go!

Registration has been extended for the 10th Annual Soovie. Mauldin BBQ Cook-off! This year's event will take place on Friday, September 18 and Saturday, September 19, 2020. Only 30 BBQ Team slots are open for this event that is sanctioned and judged by the South Carolina Barbeque Association (SCBA). Cookers can find registration packets and forms online at mauldinbbq.com or sctbarbeque.com. Registration will close on May 30 and selected cookers will be notified by mid-June.



Support your local artists! Each week, we're sending out an e-blast featuring the work of our own Cultural Center arts education instructors! These videos include theatre director Tim St. Clair's videography featuring Upstate singers; painting and drawing tutorials by the Art Haven; lessons and performances by guitar instructor Brandon Dyke; and past recital performances from voice students of Cindy Overfield. It's almost summer, which means we're bringing the beach music scene back to Mauldin with Beachin' Fridays, sponsored by Duke Energy and United Community Bank! Get ready for evenings of shag dancing, beer and wine from Growler Haus, and a variety of food trucks. All shows are free, so bring your dancing shoes, lawn chairs, and blankets - it's gonna be a long, fun, Southern night!

Beachin' Fridays was originally scheduled for May 29 - July 31. The Cultural Center is looking at rescheduling the first three concerts to August if all parties involved are able and it is safe to do so. An announcement will be made as soon as more details are available. The current line-up is subject to change, but includes: The Shag Doctorz, Cat 5, Carolina Coast Band feat. Rhonda McDaniel, The Entertainers, The Holiday Band, The Catalinas, Rhythm City Band, and The Tams.

The Cultural Center hopes to host the Mauldin Farmers Market as originally planned, but with several health and safety precautions added in light of COVID-19 and the social distancing orders put forth by the Governor of South Carolina. The Market, which takes place on Tuesdays evenings, 5-8 p.m. in June and July, features a wide variety of vendors selling locally sourced and produced dairy, eggs, honey, gifts, clothing, produce, pastries, and more!

Sports Center







Throughout April, Mauldin Fire Department personnel took part in online based training to comply with social distancing. Members completed ten online classes consisting of fire flow analysis; basic electricity; lessons learned from the Station Night Club Fire case study; writing the initial cause and origin report; residential natural gas systems; residential electric systems; understanding fire protection systems; Charleston Sofa Superstore Fire case study; Fire Investigator scene safety; and how first responders impact fire investigation. Personnel also took part in online EMT continuing education. In all, personnel trained for 1,922 hours in April.

MAULDIN ENCOURAGES COMPLETE THE 2020 CENSUS

RESIDENTS TO

Households throughout the nation have received invitations to respond to the 2020 Census. In May, the U.S. Census Bureau began following up in person with households that haven't responded. This year, for the first time ever, the U.S. Census Bureau will accept responses online, as well as by phone or mail. Responding should take less time than it takes to finish your morning coffee.

The decennial census collects basic information about the people living in each household on April 1, 2020, officially known as Census Day. The Census affects the amount of funding your community receives, how your community plans for the future, and how many seats your state is allocated in the House of Representatives. The distribution of more than \$675 billion in federal funds, grants, and support to states, counties, and communities are based on census data. That money is spent on roads, schools, hospitals, public works, and other vital programs.

The Census Bureau will never ask for Social Security numbers, bank or credit card account numbers, money or donations, or anything on behalf of a political party. Strict federal law protects your census responses. It is against the law for any Census Bureau employee to disclose or publish any census information that identifies an individual. No law enforcement agency can access or use your personal information at any time. Data collected can only be used for statistical purposes that help inform important decisions, including how much federal funding your community receives.

For some people, it's not clear how they should count themselves or the people in their home. These circumstances may include people who live in more than one place, people who moved on Census Day, people who were born or die on Census Day, or people experiencing homelessness. Respondents should count everyone who lived in a home on April 1, 2020, including anyone living and sleeping there most of the time or with no usual home elsewhere.

It is important to remember to count any children who are living with you, including foster children, grandchildren, nieces and nephews, and the children of friends (even if they are living with you temporarily); children who split their time between homes, if they were living with you on April 1; newborn babies, even those who were born on April 1, or who were still in the hospital on this date.


